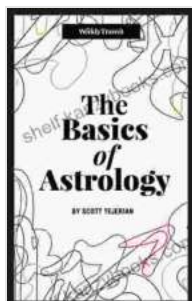

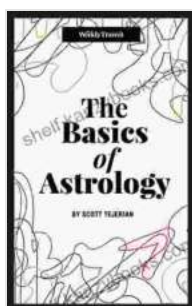
## **The Aspects**
