Causes

- Manifest Destiny: The belief popular in the United States that its destiny was to expand westward to the Pacific Ocean. This belief fueled desires to acquire Mexican territories in the Southwest.
- **Annexation of Texas:** Texas had declared independence from Mexico in 1836, but Mexico never recognized it. The United States annexed Texas in 1845, which angered Mexico and heightened tensions.
- **Disputed BFree Download:** The bFree Download between Texas and Mexico was disputed, with Mexico claiming the Nueces River as the boundary and the United States claiming the Rio Grande.

Surrender

After the fall of Mexico City, the Mexican government agreed to negotiate a peace treaty. The Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo was signed on February 2, 1848.

The treaty transferred a vast amount of land from Mexico to the United States, including the present-day states of California, Nevada, Utah, and parts of Arizona, New Mexico, Wyoming, and Colorado. In exchange, the United States paid Mexico \$15 million and assumed its debt to American citizens.

Treaties

In addition to the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, two other treaties were signed as part of the Mexican-American War settlement:

- Treaty of Mesilla (1853): This treaty acquired the Gadsden Free Download, which added a small strip of land along the southern bFree Download of New Mexico and Arizona to the United States.
- Treaty of Chamizal (1964): This treaty settled a dispute over the boundary between El Paso, Texas, and Ciudad Juárez, Mexico.


